# Strive for a "Little" Greatness Sermon Based Discussion (June 2, 2013) Sermon Series: Just a "Little"

#### WARM UP

 From our adult perspectives, what's so great about being a kid? Or what do you miss most about being a little kid?

When we're little kids, maybe we couldn't wait to grow up and do "grown up" things like drive a car, get a job, or get married. But as adults, maybe we've had days when we wished we were kids again. In this session, Jesus actually commands his followers to become like little children... again.

- 5. Why does Jesus say that being like a little child is a matter of spiritual life and death (i.e., a matter of getting into the kingdom of heaven at all)

## **DIFFERENCE**

In the sermon, Pastor Enoch described three expectations of children during Jesus' time:

- children were expected to learn
- children did tasks regardless of how impressive they may or may not have been
- children loved to receive gifts.
